


A selection of books especially selected for children in Year 1.


If your child is a very competent reader or has read all of these titles, then try the books from the Year 2 list.

Author: Mariajo Ilustrajo **Release Date:** 03/05/2022






Rain Before Rainbows

Together, they build a glorious future and discover there is a way out of the darkness, into the light of the rainbow.




Shu Lin's Grandpa


With a stunning double-spread revealing a beautiful Chinese picture, this uplifting story shows the transformative power of art and imagination in developing cultural understanding and empathy.




Meet the Oceans


Caryl Hart's rhyming text provides the perfect introduction to each ocean, slipping in fascinating facts and drawing our attention to life above and below the waves.

Author: Ross Collins Release Date: 01/10/2020





Author: Giles Andreae Release Date: 14/05/2020




Witty and characterful illustrations and a clever rhyming text tell an inspiring tale of friendship against all odds.

Author: Michelle Robinson Release Date: 07/02/2019




A lovely, lively and varied collection of verse that invites gleeful participation from its intended audience.

Author: Nicola Davies Release Date: 06/10/2016




Fans of The Gruffalo and Giraffes Can't Dance will love this feel-good rhyming story portraying a positive message about overcoming your fears.




